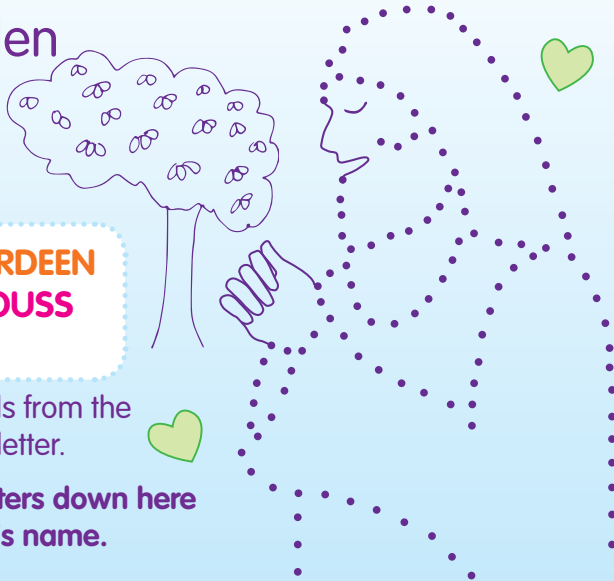

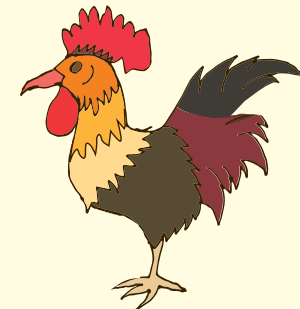
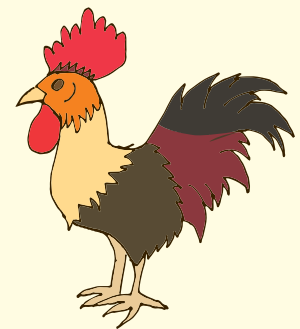

Find five differences between these two cockerels.

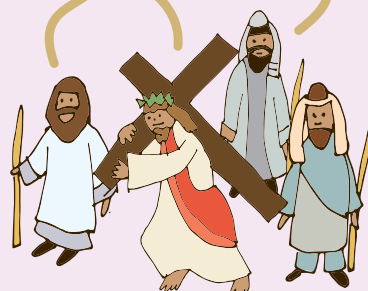
The way to the cross

Answers: Spot the difference: tail, leg, beaks, combs, feathers. In the Garden: Jesus is praying.

Make an Easter egg tree. Use branches and decorate with old materials.

Read the Easter story.

Observational drawings of Spring flowers.

Toast and butter hot cross buns together,

Bake an Easter cake with your family.

Play a game of Hide the Easter egg in the garden. Use language like hotter or colder to help find it.

Paper Mache an Easter egg and decorate.

Hard boil an egg and decorate it with paints or felts.

Build a special Easter den and share a Easter chocolate and story inside with your family.

Create an Easter gift basket.

Role play the Easter story with your teddies/toys. Perform this story to your parents.

Learn and sing and Easter / spring song. e.g. Mr Sun, Mr Sun, Mr golden Sun!

Follow a recipe and make chocolate cornflake or shredded wheat nests.

Decorate your patio./outdoor area with chalk. Draw the Easter story.

Can you make an Easter mobile out of recyclable materials e.g. cereal box?

Can you paint an Easter themed picture using just one colour?

Retell the Easter story, from Maundy Thursday and the Last Supper to Easter Sunday.

Create a table decoration for a family meal during the Easter weekend.

Design Easter eggs to put in your window for a local Easter egg hunt for when Others are on your local walk.

Can you write an Easter Play?

Draw or cut out an egg shape and write an Easter message. Display in your window.

Can you make an Easter themed cake or snacks?

Use paints, or stick coloured paper on.

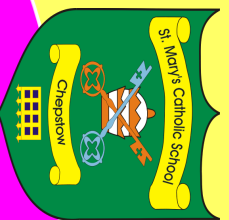
Create an Easter Egg hunt in your house or garden. Can you create clues for others?
