Dear All, This Sunday invites us to reflect on what it means to live our faith in ordinary, everyday ways. Jesus' words in the Gospel are simple and striking: "You are the salt of the earth... you are the light of the world." They invite us to reflect on how our faith is tangibly transmitted in our lives and to others. Salt and light do their work quietly. They don't draw attention to themselves, yet everything is changed by their presence. In the same way, our Christian witness can be most powerful, not in grand gestures, but in daily kindness, faithfulness, and care for one another—at home, at work, in school, and in our parish community. Saint Teresa of Calcutta taught that such acts of kindness should be offered generously, even when difficult, as living expressions of God's kindness. In her words: "Let no one ever come to you without leaving the better and happier." As we gather this weekend, we are reminded that the light we carry is not our own. It is Christ's light, received and shared, meant to shine for others so that God's goodness may be seen in the world around us. May this Sunday encourage us to let that light shine a little more brightly in the week ahead. **Fr John.**

SAINT FRANCIS XAVIER

Many of you know that I recently spent a few days on retreat in a monastery in the north of Spain, Navarre, the Abbey of San Salvador at Leyre. The abbey was refounded in 1954 by the Abbey of Silos of the Solesmes Congregation.

Not far from Leyre is Javier, the birthplace of our Patron, Saint Francis Xavier. Francis Xavier was born on 7th April 1506 and was baptised on the same day. He came from a noble family of Navarre. He studied at the university of Paris where he came under the influence of Ignatius of Loyola. Initially he regarded Ignatius who came to share rooms with him and another young student as a joke; he was sarcastic about Ignatius' efforts to convert students.

In 1530, Francis was awarded the degree of Master of Arts and later taught philosophy at the University of Paris. On 15 August 1534, seven students met in a crypt beneath the Church of Saint Denis on the hill of Montmartre, overlooking Paris. They made private vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience to the Pope, and also vowed to go to the Holy Land to convert infidels. He began his study of theology in 1534 and was ordained priest on 24 June 1537. In 1539 Ignatius drew up a formula for a new religious order, the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits). Ignatius's plan for the order was approved by Pope Paul III in 1540.

Francis eagerly accepted a commission to preach the Gospel to the peoples of the East. He arrived at Portuguese Goa, India, and began his work catechising the natives. From India he travelled to Sri Lanka, Malaysia, and Japan. Writing to Ignatius, he spoke of his missionary work, baptizing large numbers of children and teaching them the Apostles' Creed, the Lord's Prayer and the Hail Mary. The young opened their hearts to his words and put themselves at God's beck and call.

In 1552 he set out for China, a country that was closed to foreigners. He landed on the island of Shangchwan. While waiting to be put ashore secretly on the mainland, he was taken ill and died a fortnight later at the age of forty-six. His body was taken back to Goa. **Fr James**
