**Dear Friends**. By the hall there is the shrine of Pope Saint John Paul II. Last Wednesday, on his feast day, we reflected on his life during the Homily. He was elected Pope in October 1978 and died in April 2005. During his lengthy pontificate he visited many countries and came to Great Britain on a pastoral visit in 1982. His visit focussed on the seven sacraments. He will be remembered as the first non-Italian pope in hundreds of years. He was instrumental in helping to end communism in his native Poland and the rest of Europe. During his pontificate he survived an assassination attempt on his life and in his later years suffered from Parkinson's disease. He was instrumental in the promulgation of the Code of Canon Law in 1983 and in 1992 the Catechism of the Catholic Church. He wrote fourteen papal encyclicals, his first being Redemptoris Hominis, published in 1979. Here he examines major problems confronting the world at the time. John Paul II began his papacy during a crisis of self-doubt and internal criticism in the Catholic Church. He alludes to this in the encyclical's introduction, stating his confidence that the new movement of life in the Church "is much stronger than the symptoms of doubt, collapse, and crisis." He says that Jesus is real and living. Redemptor hominis proposes that the solution to these problems may be found through a fuller understanding of the person: both of the human person, and that of Christ. Fr James
