Dear All, Today we come to the final Sunday of the Church's year, the great Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (Christ the King). It is a moment that gathers up everything we have lived and prayed through these past months and places it before the One who is Lord of all time, all creation, and every human heart. This feast does not celebrate a distant or worldly ruler, but a King who reigns from the Cross, whose throne is mercy, and whose power is love. In Year C we are brought to Calvary, where Jesus reveals the true nature of his kingship: not domination, but self-giving; not fear, but forgiveness; not force, but hope. It is here that the repentant thief recognises the Kingdom breaking through, and Jesus opens for him—and for us—the promise of Paradise. In the words of the preface:

"He gave himself up for us with a wonderful love and poured out blood and water from his pierced side, the wellspring of the Church's sacraments."

Today's liturgy ends Luke's account of the long journey of Jesus to Jerusalem. It ends not in visible triumph but in a cruel death. Yet in that death He earned His right to kingship. While His kingdom is partly in this world, His kingship is of another. Our task is to build up His kingdom here on earth in order to share in the joy of His heavenly kingdom. Fr John

LECTIO DIVINA

At the Sunday Mass we have three readings from scripture. The first is from the Old Testament, except during Eastertide, when we listen to a reading from the Acts of the Apostles. This is followed by a psalm and then a reading from the New Testament, often from St Paul's letters. The Gospel follows the Alleluia verse. For the reading of the Gospel, we stand in reverence as we listen to Jesus' own words.

There is no better way of preparing for Sunday's mass than reading prayerfully and meditatively the assigned gospel passage. This is what lection divina is. Pope Benedict XVI wrote, 'The Church lives on the word of God, and the word of God echoes through the Church, in her teaching and throughout her life. In this context, I would like in particular to recall and recommend the ancient tradition of Lectio Divina: the diligent reading of Sacred Scripture, accompanied by prayer, brings about the intimate dialogue in which the person reading hears God is speaking, and in praying, responds to him with trusting openness of heart. If it is effectively promoted, this practice will bring to the Church- I am convinced of it- a new spiritual springtide. (Pope Benedict XVI, on the 40th Anniversary of Verbum Dei - 2005)

We see that Lectio Divina is reading Sacred Scripture diligently and prayerfully: it is opening one's heart to God's word and entering into a dialogue with him. This encounter with the Word of God is at the heart of the life of any Benedictine monk, as he opens the ear of his heart to God speaking to him in the scriptures, so as to grow in his love and allow himself to be transformed into his likeness.

My question to all parishioners is, What is stopping us from introducing Lectio Divina groups in the parish? Over the coming weeks, I would like you to form small groups that will gather, if possible, on a weekly basis to listen to God's Word - next Sunday's gospel. In time, we will grow in God's love as we learn to listen together to the Word of God.

Take up this invitation. Think who might join up, some parishioners who live nearby or friends. Let us get a few groups started before Christmas. Pope Benedict told the young at the World Youth Day in 2006, 'By reading the Bible, you will learn to know Christ.' Lectio Divina is about looking for the living Christ, having contact with the living word, and when one has found and made contact with the living word, enjoying and savouring it.

If you're interested, talk to your friends and make contact with me. There will be training sessions for leaders and for those who are interested. Fr James
