Dear All, Jesus' teaching on discipleship continues in today's Gospel from Luke. The passage begins with the same kind of hyperbolic statement on family relations that Jesus said a few weeks ago in the Gospel. "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother, wife and children, and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." These statements were meant to jolt Jesus' listeners into paying attention and discussing his basic message. The evangelist is referencing Micah 7:6, in which the prophet is lamenting the breaking down of family relations. The call to follow Jesus may indeed entail opposition even from those we love the most!

Now that we are shaken by this teaching, what is Jesus' message today? He makes it clear for us: "Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." This reminds us that there is nothing half-hearted about following Jesus. We will face opposition, and we will have to carry a cross - our personal cross, a suffering and burden uniquely our own. Discipleship is difficult and is something we can commit to only if we are prepared to put the Kingdom of God before everything else. Now this can often seem like giving up many things, but it is more about discovering ourselves in Christ. Recently, Pope Leo met with several members of religious congregations and exhorted them to "embrace the marvellous adventure of following Christ more closely." Fr John

Last week we reflected on the wonderful Benedictine hospitality many of us experienced at the opening of the new guest facilities at Belmont Abbey. In chapter 53 of his rule St Benedict writes that all who arrive at the monastery should be welcomed at Christ.

Jesus famously said, "I came not to be served but to serve." Throughout the gospels he puts that claim into effect in different ways. He also commands us to do the same. We obey that command in other ways too. Over the next three weeks I want to focus on how we can serve each other at the celebration of Mass. This week my focus is on the ministry of Welcome.

As parishioners of St Francis Xavier, let us live out Jesus' teaching and keep in mind the stress St Benedict places on welcoming the guest. When we welcome others, we are welcoming Christ.

When you came into church today, someone handed you this newsletter. It was a small but important gesture. A smile and a greeting showed that you were welcome and valued. Perhaps you took it for granted but imagine if no one were there, wouldn't the church seem a colder place? And what about visitors - what would be their first impressions of St Francis Xavier's Church?

Last week we mentioned our need for more welcomers at all weekend masses. This is a role that any one of us can do. The work is minimal. Turn up about 20 minutes before Mass begins. Make sure that newsletters and music are at the back of church. And then smile and greet everyone as they come in. A simple but very important way in which we can serve our parish.
