ON GAUDETE SUNDAY, THE THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT, rose coloured vestments are worn; they are also worn on the Fourth Sunday of Lent, Laetare Sunday. Both these Sundays are halfway through these sacred seasons. During the season of Advent, we prepare for the second coming of Christ at the end of time; we also prepare for the feast of Christmas, Christ's first coming: Christ coming into our world of darkness and sin, bringing his light, peace and beauty. On Gaudete Sunday, the season of Advent changes gear and we begin to focus our minds on the first coming, a gift for all. This is a matter for rejoicing, so we lay aside the purple-coloured vestments and put on rose.

Why rose-coloured vestments on the third Sunday of Advent? Why do some places have a rose-coloured candle in the wreath for that day? It's a tradition that emerged hundreds of years ago: the introit, the verses from psalm and another portion of scripture which were read as the procession approached the altar, for the third Sunday of Advent began "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice." In Latin, the words are "Gaudete in Domino semper: iterum dico, gaudete." The word rejoice-gaudete-gives the Sunday the name that many call it: Gaudete Sunday. Let us rejoice by making room for Jesus in our hearts and in our lives. Fr James



The Nativity Scene: an enchanting image The outdoor crib is back and already passers-by have commented how good it is to see once again. Among the busy hubbub of the high streets, the scene is a quiet reminder of the real reason behind Christmas.

In 2019, Pope Francis wrote an Apostolic Letter, Admirabile Signum, on the meaning and importance of the nativity scene. Why does the crib arouse such wonder and move us so deeply? The pope wrote that, "First, because it shows God's tender love: the Creator of the universe lowered himself to take up our littleness." In showing us this truth, the crib teaches us about God's closeness — Émmanuel, "God-with-us," who enters all the messy, imperfect places of life.

For children, the Nativity is a first catechism in miniature. They see love, family, wonder, and worship gathered in one place. For adults, it is a moment to pause - to recognise that the Christmas story is not just history, but a present reality. Christ is born into our lives whenever we make room for Him. Nativity scene, wanted people to feel the tenderness and joy of the Incarnation. Today, placing the crib in our homes invites that same wonder. It becomes a small sanctuary of prayer: a place to reflect on God's gift and to renew our commitment to share His peace with others.

As you prepare for Christmas, why not spend a few moments in prayer in front of your own nativity scene and bless it as a reminder of its true significance for us today: Lord, bless all who look upon this crib; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise our thoughts to him, who is God-with-us and Saviour of all, and who lives and reigns forever and ever.
