Dear friends, Last week, while spending time in Connemara in the west of Ireland, I was struck by the sheer beauty of the landscape — the changing light, the rugged mountains, the wide skies, and the sense of quiet wonder that the place inspires. Even in winter, there was a deep sense of light breaking through, revealing something timeless and enduring. This Sunday's readings echo that experience. We hear in the Gospel words spoken by the prophet Isaiah of light dawning in darkness and of Jesus beginning his public ministry, calling ordinary people to follow him. It is a reminder that God often meets us in simple, beautiful, and unexpected ways, inviting us to see more clearly and to walk in a new direction. Sometimes it requires great strength from us to set out on this journey. We must be willing to leave something of ourselves behind, to be led, not by the persuasions of others, but to stay true to ourselves and our desire "to gaze on the beauty of the Lord, to enquire at his temple." (Ps 27) The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is also the Sunday of the Word of God, encouraging us to pause and listen attentively to the voice of Christ speaking to us through Scripture. As a parish community, may we allow that Word to illuminate our lives, shape our choices, and draw us more deeply into the call to follow the Lord together. **Fr John**



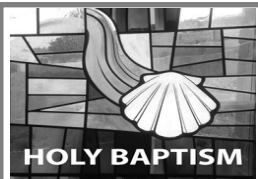

SAINT JOHN KEMBLE – 1599-1679

We are privileged to be the custodians of the relic of a martyr, one of the Forty English and Welsh Martyrs canonized by Pope Saint Paul VI in 1970. John Kemble was a 'Hereford man.' He came from a prominent local recusant Catholic family, which included four other priests. John Kemble was ordained at Douai College on 23rd February in 1625. Later that year he came to England to work as a missionary priest in Monmouthshire and Herefordshire. He served as an itinerant priest for more than 50 years, often celebrating mass at Traego Castle. Before he was led out to his execution on 22 August 1679 Kemble insisted on saying his prayers and finishing his drink, and the assembled party joined the elderly priest in a final smoke and a cup of sack. Before his death Kemble addressed the assembled crowd, pointing out that no association with the 'plot' – Titus Oates -had been charged to him. The old priest went on to say: 'The failure of the authorities in London to connect me to the plot makes it evident that I die only for profession of the Catholic religion, which was the religion that first made this Kingdom Christian.' He consoled his hangman and forgave him. Friday 30th January marks the second anniversary of the untimely death of SFX parishioner, Dennis Schiavon. Dennis had a great devotion to our local martyr, St John Kemble and it was his mission to raise the prominence of this great saint, not just within our parish, but more widely throughout Herefordshire. A small group has looked into the possibility of commissioning a statue, or some other permanent tangible memorial to St John Kemble either in the city of Hereford or at SFX church. However, difficulties with funding and protocols associated with any additions to SFX (which is a Grade II* listed building), mean that a statue is not feasible. Instead, the group is now working towards a range of low-cost projects to increase knowledge of, and devotion to, St John Kemble and other local Catholic martyrs of the 17th century.
