

Dear All, As we gather on this 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Word of God invites us to reflect on one of the most beautiful yet most challenging virtues: humility. Saint Augustine wrote that "it was pride that changed angels into devils; it is humility that makes men as angels". In the Gospel today, Jesus reminds us that those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted. True greatness in the Kingdom of God does not come from seeking recognition, honour, or reward, but from lowering ourselves in service to others.

We are also reminded that our generosity should mirror God's own — freely given, without calculation or expectation of repayment. To welcome those who cannot repay us, to serve those who may never thank us, is to love as Christ loves. The first reading identifies greatness with humbleness. Humility is a recognition of the truth. Its foundation is self-knowledge and a realization of our proper relationship with God. As we come to this Eucharist, we bring before the Lord our pride, our ambitions, our self-interest, and ask for the grace to become humble disciples — content with the "lowest place," knowing that in Christ we find our true dignity and our eternal reward. **Fr John**

THE RECEPTION OF GUESTS - THE RULE OF SAINT BENEDICT

Many parishioners attended the Opening of the new guest facilities at Belmont Abbey on Thursday 27th August. We all came away feeling we had experienced Benedictine Hospitality. St Benedict devotes a chapter (53) to the Reception of Guests. In the opening verses St Benedict writes that all who arrive should be received as Christ, for he himself will say, I was a stranger and you took me in. In the first half of this beautiful chapter we're told that guests should be received as we would receive Christ himself. The first task is to pray with the guest. We welcome the guest warmly to seal one's encounter in the peace of Christ and go to the Oratory, the Church, to pray and listen to scripture. This is a reminder to the guest that Christ lives in his heart and that he is being welcomed in the manner that Christ would be welcomed. The scriptures are read and prayed. Here all encounter the Living Word. Before sharing a meal with the guests the abbot washes their hands and the whole community washes their feet. It would seem strange for us to welcome a guest by pouring water and washing their feet. Christ himself washed the feet of his disciples at the Last Supper, a task that slaves carried out. In today's busy world many guests who arrive at a monastery come for a rest, to pray and to encounter the Lord. Often guests arrive at the door of the guest house feeling tired and flustered from a complicated journey. The warm and spiritual encounter is at the heart of monastic hospitality. The quality St Benedict wishes the person in charge of the guest house to posses is that he should be 'God fearing'; this means someone whose soul the fear of God possesses. In the Book of Genesis, chapter 18, we encounter Abraham showing hospitality to three visitors by the Oaks of Mamre, who are later understood to be God in human form and two angels. This divine encounter fulfils God's promise to Abraham, with one of the visitors announcing that his elderly wife, Sarah, would bear a son named Isaac within a year. The story highlights themes of divine promise, hospitality, and faith, and is often interpreted as the Holy Trinity. Abraham's guests were unexpected. Many of our guests will have booked their accommodation in good time. Whatever the circumstances, let

whatever the circumstances, let us keep those beautiful words we sang on Thursday at the Blessing of the Chapterhouse, Ubi caritas et amor, Deus ibi est, Where true love is dwelling, God is present there, in our hearts and minds. **Fr James**
