THE HOLY FAMILY: THE ORIGINAL PROTOTYPE



The Feast of the Holy Family invites us to pause and reflect on the simple yet profound life shared by Jesus, Mary and Joseph. In a quiet home in Nazareth, God chose to dwell within an ordinary family, sanctifying family life itself. In their love, patience, work, and faithfulness, the Holy Family shows us that holiness is most often lived out not in extraordinary moments, but in the everyday rhythms of home life. "The most extraordinary thing in the world," as G.K. Chesterton said, "is an ordinary man and an ordinary woman and their ordinary children." At the heart of the Holy Family's life was trust in God. Mary pondered all things in her heart, Joseph listened and acted on God's word, and Jesus grew "in wisdom and age and favour before God and others." Their home was shaped by prayer—by attentiveness to God's presence and openness to God's will. This reminds us that prayer is not something added on to family life; it is what gives family life its deepest meaning and strength. Family prayer, in all its forms, is a powerful way of keeping Christ at the centre of the home. It need not be complicated or lengthy. A simple grace before meals, a short prayer at bedtime, the Rosary, or reading a few lines of Scripture together can become sacred moments. In prayer, families learn to give thanks, to ask forgiveness, to share hopes and worries, and to place their trust in God together. As Pope Francis said: "The family is alive if it is united in prayer." To help foster this prayer, please do take one of the little leaflets in the narthex entitled 'Prayers for my family.' Inspired by the Holy Family, may our homes be places where prayer is lived simply and faithfully, and where love is strengthened day by day. **Fr John**
